Saisaki Mo-de

A new phenomena has begun in Japan due to Covid-19.

In Japan, millions make a special trip to shrines and temples, on the first three days of the new year.

Instead of visiting a shrine on January 1, shrines are calling out to the community to visit shrines in December to pray for an early and auspicious start of the new year.

This new practice is called *Saisaki Mo-de* literally meaning "visiting the shrine early for happiness."

Here at Hawaii Kotohira Jinsha • Hawaii Dazaifu Tenmangu - we will be accepting visitors from **December 26, 2020 - February 2,**

2021 in a move to spread out crowds.

All worship will be done "Japan style" where one prays on their own.

Stay safe and beat the crowds with *Saisaki Mo-de* and our *Omamori* Early Selection days.

Omamori will be available in the basement meeting room from 12/26 - 12/30.

12/31 - 1/3 omamori will be in the preschool.

From 1/4 Monday until 1/6 Wed, omamori will be offered in the shrine.

Omamori will be available in the shrine on an Honor System from 1/7 Thurs till early December.

Nusa - implements of purification

O-nusa is an ancient implement used in purification rituals.

O-nusa consists of a branch of *sakaki* with strips of paper.

The ancient Japanese embraced *harai* purification as the most effective method of purging negative energies.

Since ancient times, hemp has played an important function in Shinto.

Hemp strips were attached to sticks and used to wave over an individual to symbolically cleanse them of impurities and imbue one with positive energies.

This new years, hemp strips will be combined with *shide* zigzag strips, hemp rope and Hawaiian Ti leaves and inserted into the shimenawa on the torii gate.

By walking under this special *O-nusa*, one will be undergoing symbolic purification and experience a renewal of our souls. We will also be returned to our sacred nature.



This will serve the same purpose as having a Priest's assistant wave a *Gohei* wand over your heads at New Years.

This special O-nusa will be placed on the torii gate on 12/30.

The shrine celebrated 100 years this fall. As part of moving into the next century, we looked at the changing landscape of the community and the immense challenges presented by COVID-19 and made a few improvements to keep the shrine healthy and vibrant.

As we move into a new chapter of human history, we strive to perpetuate the spiritual richness of Shinto for present and future generations.
