Tidbits 8-8

August 8 is Father's Day in Taiwan and like many other customs, traditions and beliefs in China, it all surrounds a play on words.

In Chinese, the word for father is 'Ba Ba' and the number 8 is also pronounced as 'ba'. Thus, August 8 was chosen to celebrate Father's Day in Taiwan.

During the weekends prior to this special day, restaurants are booked to capacity.

Cute tuxedo cakes and round-faced father cakes are displayed at local bakeries. Stores have sales on electronic gadgets and other 'manly' items. Red envelopes containing lucky money are presented as gifts to Dad's all over the country.

Close family ties are the norm in Taiwan so it is not surprising to have three, sometimes four generations dining together on these occasions. In Taoism, 8 is associated with wholeness and completeness. According to I Ching, the eight trigrams are the foundation that generates everything in the universe.

The Eight Directions represent the whole universe in Taoist spatial conception. These eight directions are also used to explain individual destiny, a Chinese fortune-telling method that depicts one's life course according to the trigram of one's date of birth.

The number 8 in Chinese culture indicates prosperity and wealth because it sounds like the Chinese word for "becoming rich".

Associating 8 with money is believed to have originated in Cantonese culture, especially in the business hub of Hong Kong - and soon became popular in other parts of China, as the country and its people pursued economic development and attained material gains and profits.

Businessmen in China see number 8 as the luckiest number of all and try to include it in the company address, phone number or even product price, hoping to run a profitable and successfully business.

Having several of the number 8 in a phone number or a license plate can command sky-high prices. The phone number 8888-8888 was sold for US\$280,000 to China's Sichuan Airlines at an auction a decade ago.

Another reason why the number 8 symbolizes good luck is because it is a perfect symmetrical shape. Perfect symmetry lends itself to perfect balance, which is considered the ideal in Chinese Astrology.

Therefore, it should come as no surprise that the Olympic games in China started at 8:08 pm on August 8, 2008. Love-A-Keiki Preschool was burglarized on Wednesday, July 26 at approximately 4:30 am.
