# CALENDAR

Here are some of the protocols from Hatsumode 2023, implemented again this year to keep you safe.

- Encouraged Japan-style worship without a priest assistant waving a paper wand over one's head, to prevent virus spread.
- Bell and ropes at the shrine were removed in February 2020 to prevent cross contamination.
- We offered Saisaki-mode and Early Selection of *omamori* which began on December 26 for those who preferred not to gather en masse.
- *Ozoni* service was once again canceled to minimize any possibility of virus-borne illnesses
- Hand sanitizers were placed throughout the property
- Enhanced and frequent cleaning with UV lights and hospital-grade disinfectants.

- All *omamoris* were packaged and sanitized with UV lights throughout the day.
- Floors of the *omamori a*rea were swept and mopped frequently as were all high-touch surfaces.
- Check out and *omikuji* booths were placed in well ventilated areas.

• Tap-and-go credit cards, ApplePay, GooglePay were accepted for contact-free transactions. All terminals were disinfected after each use.

For the third year, we hope our commitment for strengthening safety and sanitizing measures to prevent the spread of viruses in welcoming all of you have provided everyone with a safe, sanitary and inviting environment and your continued trust and loyalty.

Many Shinto shrines hold O-oharae or purification rituals twice a year. These rituals are said to have originate around 701 CE

The Toshikoshi no O-oharae or yearend purification rituals on New Year's eve to disperse negative energies accumulated over the second half of the year and to pray for good health and to revitalize one's energy in the coming 6 months.

The Nagoshi no O-oharae or summer purification ritual is held in June by passing through the Chinowa ring made of leaves. Here at the shrine, we welcome pets - dogs, cats, birds, etc. to our summer event to join us in walking through the Ti leaf ring.

The yearend ritual was held on December 31 in the presence of Bryson Goda (President) , Diane Nishida (VP) and Linda Shinsato (Secretary).
