### Law & Order



Rev. Takizawa was served with a subpoena to appear in court and offer truthful testimony on an attempted burglary case that occurred at the shrine on January 20, 2018.

A young male entered the shrine at approximately 5:00 AM while Rev. Takizawa was cleaning and preparing to open for the day. The main gate on Olomea Street was closed and locked. The shrine's main door was open.

Upon hearing strange sounds in the shrine, Rev. Takizawa came out of the office and proceeded to search for the source of the strange sounds.

He encountered a young male running

out of the shrine and eventually chased the intruder to the Olomea Street fence.

The intruder had climbed the fence and was on the other side but Rev. Takizawa was able to grab his slippers and exchange a few words.

The intruder can be seen on video rummaging through the drawers of the shrine desk, seemingly with the intention of committing theft.

This is the first time one of the shrine's burglary cases has gone to trial.

## Maintenance

**Roof Project #1:** The shrine's multi-purpose hut suffered from rot as the result of moisture reaching the wood under the shingles.

On June 12, the rotting shingles were removed and a new decking board was placed on the structure. A metal L-shaped drip-edge was installed along the eaves to protect the shingles from potential water damage which may cause the shingles and decking board to erode.

Roofing felt was then placed over the drip-edge and decking board, covered by a waterproof barrier material and topped with asphalt shingles secured with nails.
